Multiple Birth Families

Statement

At Cherry Blossom Nursery and Preschool, we aim to ensure that all families are included and supported, no matter how big or small. As a nursery we accommodate all families and work together with parents to ensure all children are treated as individuals and supported to make the best progress they can.

Twins, triplets and other multiple birth children will have unique relationships with their sibling, different to any other relationship in the nursery, this will be taken into account with all aspects of care and learning.

Procedures

We will...

- Acknowledge multiple birth relationships as special and to be celebrated as well as to support the children to develop as individuals.
 - Explore each child's preferences, interests, needs and starting points.
- Complete separate forms for each child (where age appropriate) to discover their routines, specific requirements and interests.
- Recognise each child and call them by name. Differences will be noted and used to enable each child to be seen as an individual.
 - Recognise and celebrate all individual achievements.
 - Report back on each child separately at the end of the day to the parents.
- Consider separation if this is beneficial to the child's development. Parents and children will be involved in this decision.
- Each child will be graded by the EYFS, they will not be compared to each other.
 - Ensure all staff are able to identify each child and know their name.
 - Consideration regarding slight reduction of fees may be considered at the discretion of the managers.
